### Caution: We can do all the right things for all the wrong reasons.

In order that we do not fall into this trap, consider the following...

- I. When you strive to be a good member of a local church,  
you should do so **NOT** to be saved, but **BECAUSE** you have been saved.
  
- II. When you strive to be a good member of a local church,  
you should do so **NOT** to be more loved by God, but **BECAUSE** He already loves you.
  
- III. When you strive to be a good member of a local church,  
you should do so **NOT** to be accepted or esteemed by others, but to be pleasing to **GOD**.
  
- IV. Your involvement in Christ's church as a good member is  
**NOT** (primarily) for **YOU** to be served, but that you might serve **OTHERS** in the name of Christ.
